Here we go.. On Friday, the wettest coldest most miserable day of the year we and the Riesers went for a ride to check-out several campgrounds.

Our first stop was Huron Lake RV park, located just north of Port Sanilac. We found this to be a nice park meeting our 007 standards. Priced from \$27 to \$69 bucks a night. The \$27 sites had water and electric, flat grass, with room at the rear of the site for activities, and an open air pool. Parks is new, open a couple years ago.

Second stop, Foster County RV Park. Located further north of Port Sanilac. This park is on lake Huron with grass sites, water, electric and sewer.

Older park with a lot of permanent but a good number of transit sites. Smaller sites than Lake Huron but still within 007 standards. Price \$23 a night.

Last stop was Wagener County RV Park, located 5 miles south of Harbor Beach. Here we have some full hookup sites to the rear of the park, we are sure these fill immediately at the first of the year. One block walk to the Huron beach we found about hundred sites with electric-only and water available nearby. Priced \$18 for the electric and \$22 for the full hookup.

We cannot make reservations till after January 2nd.
